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The Reno Odlin Papers

Biography:

Reno Woodbridge Odlin was born June 26, 1897 at Sedro (later Sedro-Woolley), Washington, to Jessie Lee (Reno) and William Thompson Odlin. W. T. Odlin was a banker who later served as mayor of Anacortes, Washington. Reno graduated from the DeKoven School for Boys at Steilacoom, Washington, in June 1914. In the fall of 1914, Reno entered Princeton University, studying there for a year. In 1915, Reno entered the University of Washington. In 1916, Reno served in the U.S. Army stationed on the Mexican border. In 1917, he served in the American Expeditionary Forces in France during the First World War. Reno attained the rank of second lieutenant in the 161st Infantry, and saw action during the battles of the Marne and the Meuse-Argonne. After the Armistice, Reno attended a university for veterans, the University of Toulouse, for about six months. Reno was sent home in June, 1919, and honorably discharged in October. He never graduated from college.

Reno was employed from 1919-20 as Chief Clerk in the maintenance department of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company. In 1921, Reno was hired as a director and cashier of the Citizens Bank of Anacortes, the bank his father ran. Reno became assistant vice president of the Metropolitan National Bank of Seattle in 1928. This institution soon merged with other banks to form the Seattle-First National Bank. In 1932, Reno was elected vice president of Seattle-First National Bank, and the next year he became president of the banks Olympia branch.

In 1934, Reno briefly entered the political world in an attempt to be elected to the United States Senate. As the nominee of the Republican Party, Reno was anti-New Deal, anti-FDR, and lost overwhelmingly to his opponent, Lewis B. Schwellenbach; reportedly, Reno was swept by Schwellenbach in every county.

In 1936, Reno was invited to become president of the Puget Sound National Bank. Reno served as president from 1936 to 1962, when he assumed the title of Chairman and Chief Executive Officer. After his retirement in 1974, Reno assumed the title of Honorary Chairman.

Reno Odlin served as a director of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco from 1938-44, and was a member of the Federal Advisory Council from 1946-50. During World War II, Reno was very active in the selling of war bonds. In July, 1943, Reno was appointed by Secretary of the Treasury Henry Morgenthau, Jr., as Chairman of the War Finance Committee for Washington State, for the salary of a dollar a year. He was a tireless promoter of war bonds, making numerous

speeches and radio appearances throughout the state, and Washington State far surpassed the quota assigned to the state by the Treasury Department. Reno was awarded a certificate of merit for his work by Secretary of the Treasury Fred M. Vinson in February, 1946. After the war, Reno continued serving in this same position, as State Chairman of the U.S. Savings Bonds Division of the Treasury Department, until 1974. In January, 1969, during the last days of the presidency of Lyndon B. Johnson, Reno was awarded a Distinguished Service Award by the Treasury Department.

Reno served as president of the Washington Bankers Association from 1942-43. In 1963, Reno was elected national Vice President of the American Bankers Association, and became the first person from Washington State to serve as President of the ABA, from 1964-65.

In 1922, Reno married Edith Murphy Heston, and they had three children, Mary Lee, Reno William, and Richard. In 1964, Edith died after several years of poor health. In 1965, Reno married Mrs. Beatrice Reno Marshall, an adopted cousin of his, whom he had known for forty years.

Reno served on the board of directors of numerous organizations, such as the Washington Natural Gas Company, the Pacific First Federal Savings and Loan Association, and the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Reno was a devotee of the theater and opera. He acted in a few plays in the army, but his largest role was as the lead role of the Stage Manager in Thornton Wilder's "Our Town", at the Tacoma Little Theater in February and March, 1947. Reno served as president of the Tacoma Little Theater in 1947-48. Reno's brother, Dick Odlin, was an accomplished Broadway actor, and served as director of the Tacoma Little Theater beginning in 1952, until his death in 1958.

Reno also enjoyed mountain climbing. He climbed the Matterhorn after the First World War. In his later years, Reno loved reading about mountain climbing, and served on the Board of Directors of the Rainier National Park Company and the Snoqualmie National Forest Advisory Board.

Reno's biggest hobby was as an amateur historian. His major interest was the Civil War; his great-uncle Major General Jesse Lee Reno was killed at the battle of South Mountain, Maryland, in 1862. Reno served as president of the Washington State Historical Society from 1955 to 1976, being elected for seven three-year terms. Reno led several campaigns to remodel the C. F. Ferry Museum during his term.

Among the numerous honors Reno received were the Distinguished Service Award of the Seattle Chamber of

Commerce, awarded in 1932, the Captain Robert Gray Award, awarded by the Washington State Historical Society in 1976, and the Brotherhood Award, awarded by the Tacoma Chapter of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, in 1976.

Reno died at the age of 82, on September 15, 1979. After his retirement, the Puget Sound National Bank was managed by William Philip, his ex son-in-law. During the early 1990s, Puget Sound National Bank was bought out by Key Bank.

Scope and Content Note:

The Reno Odlin Papers consist primarily of correspondence, but also include reports, memoranda, awards, scrapbooks, newspaper and magazine clippings, and ephemera. The inclusive dates are from 1832 to 1979; however, bulk dates are from 1940 to 1974. The volume of the collection is 26.5 cubic feet: 25 cubic foot boxes and three oversize boxes.

The collection originally came to the Washington State Historical Society in six separate accessions between 1976 and 1982. The original order of the collection was straight chronological order, while being divided up into broad categories. During processing, the collection was divided into six broad series: Business Activities, War Finance Council/U.S. Savings Bonds Division, Civic Activities, Personal Activities, Political Activities, and the Correspondence File.

The Business Activities series is dominated by two large groups, the American Business Association and the Puget Sound National Bank. The records of the ABA during Reno Odlin's presidency are documented under the "ABA, Presidential Files" group. Records of the Puget Sound National Bank are, like all of the other records, very sporadic; well documented in some years, poorly documented in other years.

The War Finance Committee and U.S. Savings Bonds Division series documents Reno Odlin's work in promoting savings bonds. This series is very well documented during World War II, with much information on the various war bond loan drives in Washington State. During the post-war years, the War Finance Committee became the U.S. Savings Bonds Division of the Treasury Department, and records become sporadic. Reno Odlin's trip to the Supreme Headquarters of Allied Personnel in Europe (SHAPE) during 1952 is well documented, however.

The Civic Activities Series is dominated by the Tacoma General Hospital, of which Reno Odlin was on the board of directors, and the Washington State Historical Society, of which Reno Odlin was president.

The Personal Activities series contains individual correspondence from family members of Reno Odlin's, as well as correspondence to and from third parties that deals specifically with that family member. Additionally, the several trust accounts that Reno Odlin established for his children and grandchildren are documented in this series.

The Correspondence Files were originally filed by year usually under the heading of "Reno Odlin- Correspondence." The files, usually of a trivial informational manner, have been divided alphabetically. The container list contains a listing of every person in the Correspondence Files series, with the number of items, and in many cases, the business affiliation of the person. Outgoing and incoming correspondence were originally filed together, and this arrangement has been retained.
